





Disruption of Education Services

Our team conducts informative sessions on various health topics, including nutrition, common illnesses, and preventive measures. We provide practical tips and advice to help community members make informed decisions about their health and well-being.

Interactive Workshops

We conduct interactive workshops in slum areas, focusing on health and sanitization practices. We engage community members in discussions, demonstrations, and hands-on activities to raise awareness about proper hygiene, disease prevention, and the importance of sanitation.
